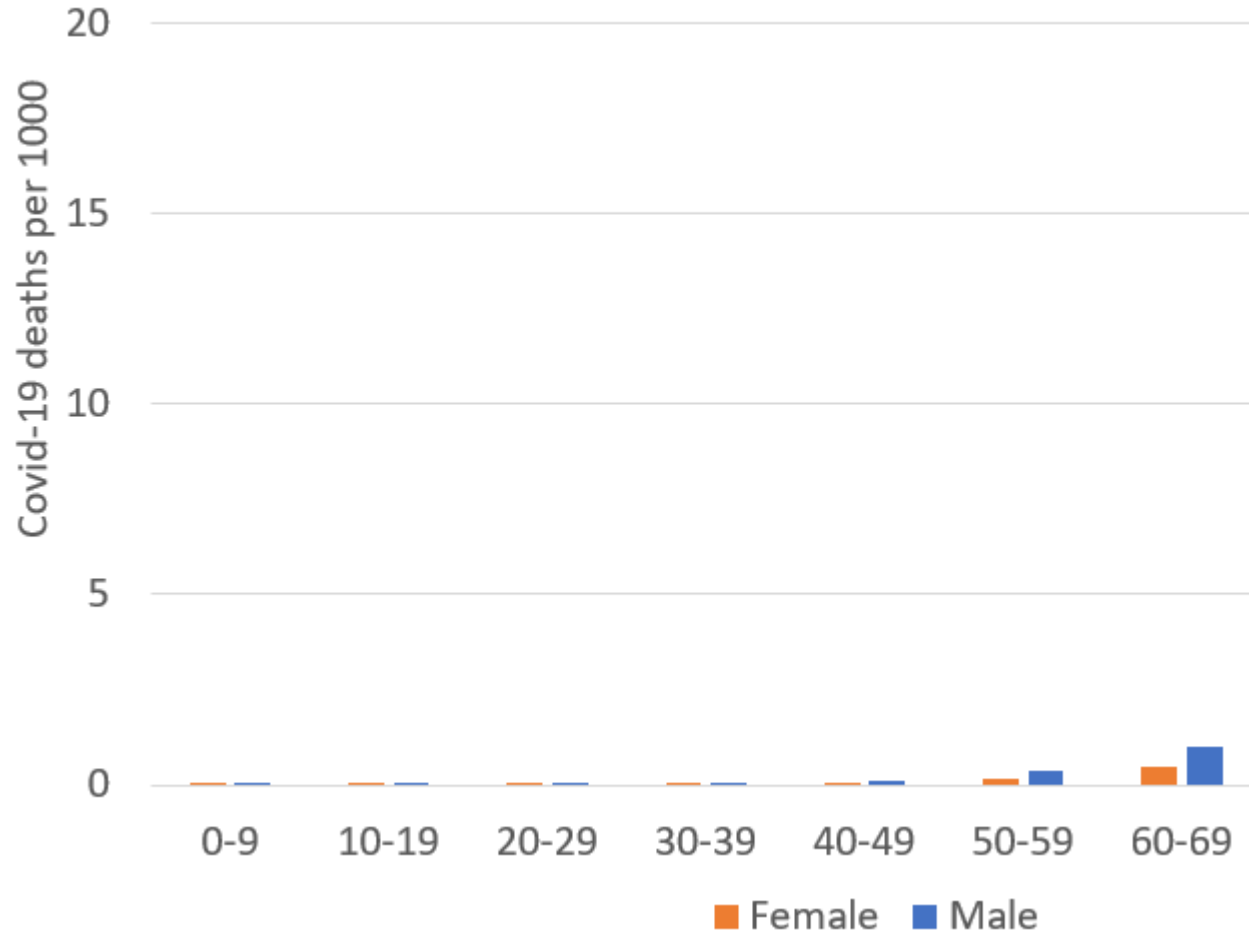


Covid

The risks:

- Healthy under 70s have a very very low risk of having any complications from Covid
- Most under 20s have no symptoms or very mild symptoms



ONS

What is the school doing

To reduce the risk of transmission we have:

- Reduced movement around school
- Increased cleaning
- Created bubbles which are kept apart, including staggered start/finish/breaks
- Told students and staff to wear masks

Public Health England's definition of contacts

- Within 1 meter AND
- Face to face
- For more than 1 min



- Within 2 meters AND
- More than 15 mins

- Within 1 meters AND
- Coughed on OR Skin to skin contact

All staff **MUST** avoid breaking these with students or other staff

You need to:

- Use one way systems
- Wear masks outside of classroom
- Stay 2 meters away from teachers

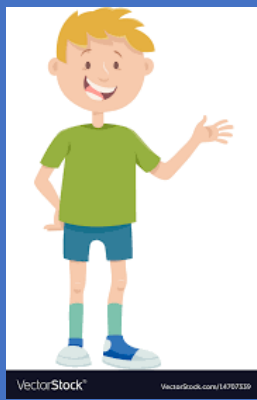
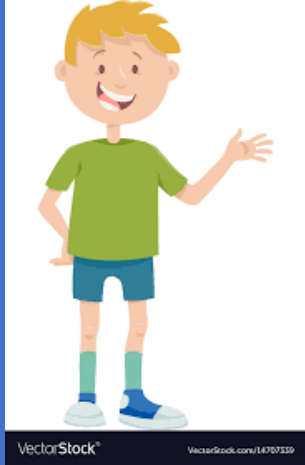

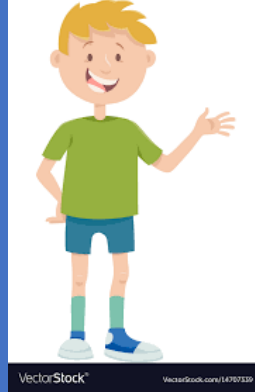
Why has year 7 and year 12 been asked to self isolate?

- Self isolation stops the transmission of the virus from those who are infected, or close contacts at risk of infection, to the wider community
- We have had one student in year 7 test positive and one student in year 12 test positive.
- We carry out a robust and detailed track and trace investigation to identify close contacts in discussion with Public Health England. Sometimes this may mean only a smaller group within a bubble needs to isolate (eg KS3 tutor group or just Y12 within 6th form bubble) but sometimes the whole year group bubble need to self isolate.

Only people in direct contact have to self isolate

Not in direct contact. So less risk and doesn't need to self isolate.
